

^{*} FOR THE INTRO: You play a G chord, then while holding down the low G note there's that little descending phrase of three chords. Those chords (apart from the low G note that you hold down throughout) consist of two notes each. (b string first fret/ d string first fret; then b string open/d string open; then g string 2nd fret/ a string 3rd fret) Then a G chord again. PLAY THE WHOLE THING TWICE AND YOU'VE GOT THE INTRO
